

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
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

The play will be performed in both English and Cantonese. **DIRECTOR'S NOTE:** The idea of generational trauma scares the shit out of me. In an increasingly structuralist world - where everything from career pathways to gender are based on society's development and self-imposed worlds, some things transcend these structures. Our humanity. Our DNA. When we think of nurture vs. nature, I think it's impossible to deny what we know and feel in our blood. The universality of this play has always tickled me-- I think whether one is born to Israeli fisherman, Pakistani chicken-fryers, or Swedish software developers, we share connections to our past. To our deeper-rooted humanity. We are more similar than not, and we all come from somewhere.

athena kaitlin trinh is a recent acting graduate from the National Theatre School of Canada. She is a Dora nominated, queer, Chinese-Vietnamese actor, writer, and spoken-word poet. With roots stemming from Brampton, Toronto, and Ho Chi Minh city, athena celebrates her Chinese-Vietnamese heritage and dedicates herself to diverse, intersectional, and inclusionary art-making. athena is a settler in Tkaronto, on the traditional territories of the Mississaugas, the Huron-Wendat and the Haudenosaunee peoples. DIANA TSO, "PO PO"

Diana Tso is a storyteller and theatre artist. She's a graduate of the University of Toronto in English Literature and of Ecole Internationale de Theatre de Jacques Lecoq in France. As artistic director of Red Snow Collective, her plays *Red Snow* and *Comfort* bring to light the resilience of women in war, advocating justice and peace. Her *Monkey Queen* stories are a re-imagining of the monkey mythologies of the east from the perspective of the woman warrior. Most recently she performed in *The Cherry Orchard* (Modern Times Stage Company), *Les Misérables* (Theatre Smith-Gilmour), and *Bakkhai* and *The Komagata Maru Incident* (Stratford Festival 2017 season).

ANGELA SUN, PRODUCER

Angela Sun is a mad, fat, first generation/settler theatre performer, creator, producer, arts administrator, and writer of East Asian descent. She has previously worked on the Next Stage productions of *Silk Bath* and *Ga Ting* and most recently produced *Above & Beyond* at last year's Toronto Fringe Festival. She has performed and/or created with numerous established and emerging theatre companies and festivals in Toronto.

Lily Chan is a Chinese-Canadian, Toronto-based theatrical manager and consultant. She is drawn to building works that grant experiences and perspectives which provoke and entertain. She is a graduate of The National Theatre School of Canada's Production Design and Technical Arts program.

JEFF HO, DRAMATURGE

Jeff Ho is a Toronto-based theatre artist, originally from Hong Kong. Favourite acting credits include: Ophelia in *Prince Hamlet* (Why Not Theatre National Tour: Canadian Stage, PuSh Festival, National Arts Centre), *trace* (Factory theatre/b current), *Hana's Suitcase* (Tour: Toronto/Montreal/Seattle/YPT). 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
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
