
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
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

BILAL BAIG, CREATOR & PERFORMER

Bilal Baig is a queer, trans-feminine, Muslim playwright, director, actor and workshop facilitator. Writing credits include: *Khwaja Sera* (in development at Buddies), *ERASER* (Why Not Theatre) and *Acha Bacha* (TPM/Buddies 2018). Bilal has directed work at the Rhubarb Festival, RISER Project and SummerWorks. Bilal facilitates story creation workshops in under-resourced communities and schools across Toronto through Story Planet, and facilitates anti-Islamophobia workshops in the GTA with the Rivers of Hope Collective.

TAWIAH M'CARTHY, DIRECTOR

Tawiah M'Carthy is a Ghanaian born, Toronto based artist; actor/playwright/ creator/director, notable as a Dora-nominated actor and playwright. In his practice, Tawiah uses both African and Western theatre traditions, often combining movement, sound and text together with theatrical structure, characterization and design. His playwright/creator/performer credits include *Black Boys, Maanoma, My Brother, Obaaberima* (Dora for Best Production) and *The Kente Cloth*.

VIRGILIA GRIFFITH, MOVEMENT COACH

André du Toit is a lighting designer for live performance based in Toronto. Recent designs include *Prince Hamlet* (Why Not Theatre); *Getting Married*, *The Orchard* (Shaw Festival); *Now You See Her, Mouthpiece* (Quote Unquote Collective); *Paolozzapedia, Italian Mime Suicide, The Double* (Bad New Days); *Guarded Girls, Harlem Duet* (Tarragon Theatre); *The Cave, Le Grand Continental* (Luminato); *Animal Farm, A Delicate Balance, Vimy, The 39 Steps*, (Soulpepper); *Oraltorio* (Obsidian/Soulpepper).

STEPH RAPOSO, SOUND DESIGNER

Steph Raposo is a sound, lighting, and video designer, as well as a full-time venue technician at Buddies In Bad Times Theatre. Recent Credits: Technical Director, *Here Are The Fragments* (The Theatre Centre); Sound Designer, *United Way: #Unignorable Installation* (Nocturne Halifax); Video Designer, *Four Sisters* (Paradigm Theatre); Festival Lighting Designer, Paprika Festival.

SEBASTIAN MARZIALI, SET DESIGNER

Sebastian Marziali is a Uruguayan-Canadian performer, designer, and creator based in Toronto. Sebastian was lighting designer on the 2018 & 2019 Toronto International Burlesque Festival, and 2019 Vanguardia Dance Festival. They performed in, designed, and choreographed for sold-out Toronto Fringe hits *Lysistrata, Carmilla, and Mayhem at Miskatonik*. Most recently they appeared in A Streetcar Named Desire at Soulpepper.

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
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
