Rebecca Ballarin is a theatre director and producer, currently based in Toronto. In addition to her training at U of T, she has completed directing workshops with a number of prominent Canadian directors, including Kim Collier and Jackie Maxwell. Recent credits include: As Director - *Hedwig and the Angry Inch*, 7 Stories (Hart House Theatre), O (United Solo Festival), 291 (Parados Festival); As Assistant Director - *The Flick* (Outside the March & Crow's Theatre), Pearle Harbour's Chautauqua (Pearle Harbour), The Haunting of Hungerford House (Tweed & Company).

Rebecca is the Artistic Producer of Pearle Harbour and most recently coproduced *Pearle Harbour's Chautauqua*, which was part of Theatre Passe Muraille's 2018-2019 season and subsequently toured to the High Performance Rodeo, OUTstages Festival, and The Cultch. She also works with Animacy Theatre Collective and Tweed & Company Theatre in a producing capacity.

Steven Conway, MUSICAL DIRECTOR + ACCOMPANIST

Steven Conway (they/them) is an inter-disciplinary performer and musician based in Toronto. With a classical education in piano and music theory, they are self-taught in over a dozen instruments, and teach music to children of all ages. Steven has an MA from U of T's Centre for Drama, Theatre, and Performance Studies, with a focus on the ethics and aesthetics of participatory performance. They play in local bands *Slurry* and *The Brain*, and host the monthly event *Bands & Drag*, which aims to bridge Toronto's queer performance scenes.

Logan Raju Cracknell, LIGHTING DESIGNER

Logan Raju Cracknell is a Toronto based Lighting Designer for theatre, dance, opera, and live events. He graduated from the York University Theatre Production program. This season he is headed to the Stratford Festival as one of the Assistant Lighting Designers. He is excited to be working with Pearle and the rest of the team again on this production of *Agit-Pop!* Lighting design credits include: *Judas Noir* (BDB/Obsidian), *News Play* (Prairie Fire, Please!), *D.E.W.* (Pearle Harbour), *Silk Bath* (Silk Bath Collective), *East of Berlin* (Essential Collective Theatre), *Impulse* (School of Toronto Dance Theatre).

Adam Miller, VIDEO DESIGNER

Adam Miller is a musician and videographer living in Toronto. He holds a BFA in Intermedia Cyber Arts from Concordia University. Previously based in Montreal, he recently returned to Ontario to work in film. He designed video and projection for earlier iterations of *Agit-Pop!*

NOTES ON THE SHOW:
