



MARY HENDERSON

Two women named Mary Henderson arrive at an emergency room, looking for their sons. Although their circumstances link them together, there is a key difference in how their following moments will play out – because one Mary is Black and one is White. This show was born from the sense of outrage, disgust and shame creator Bonnie Anderson felt at being a White person after events of this past year. "We are the ones who keep systemic racism alive because we are the ones who benefit from it. We are the ones who have to change." An excerpt from *The Mary-Go-Round Project*, in which The Marys, whether contemporary or historical, express how we are feeling about the world right now.

In the winter of 2019 Graham Isador (*VICE, GQ*) was tasked with creating a version of edgy morning television for a major Canadian broadcaster. The process was marked with two overwhelming challenges: 1. Edgy morning television is not a very good idea. 2. His degenerative eye disease was causing problems on set. Exploring themes of creative and physical limitations, *Blind Confidence* is the latest solo work from this "master storyteller" (*Toronto Guardian*).

Miracle on Avenue du Parc tells the story of the strange Christmas where Thea Fitz-James and her siblings bought their own Christmas presents. Set in post-Dickensian small-town Quebec, this is a modern-day Gift of Magi, where the youngest of the family navigate their parent's divorce, the challenge of Christmas shopping on a budget, and the visit of an unlikely holiday guest. Heartwarming and funny, this story is about a low-income family, and how they turn family dysfunction into holiday tradition.
