The Toronto Fringe is the largest theatre festival in Ontario, founded in 1989 we pride ourselves on providing a platform for every artist and especially those who might not have an opportunity to perform otherwise. We believe every story has a right to be shared and the support of our donors makes that possible. Toronto Fringe is a creative match-maker, connecting artists with audiences, and empowering everyone to unleash their artist within. Toronto Fringe creates vital opportunities for both emerging and established artists to produce their work with complete artistic freedom, while making productions as affordable and accessible as possible.

We welcome approximately 100 companies every July from around Canada and the world to our 14 theatre venues in downtown Toronto. Over the course of 12 days, over 1,000 artists participate in performances across the city that include comedy, drama, musicals, improvisation, storytelling, children's theatre, dance and much more.

### Did you know?

### \$500-\$800

Is the cost for a fringe artist to participate in the Festival. With this fee they receive a venue, front of house staff, ticketing services, marketing with listings on our website and brochure (both online and printed) and seminars that aid them through the A-Z of the producing experience When you produce a show at Fringe, you're joining a community.

### \$3000

Is a more accurate cost of what Fringe pays per company, and that is a fraction of what it would cost to produce a show outside of the fringe model. The Toronto fringe offers this subsidy to create more opportunities and it is our goal to offer participation fees on a sliding scale but we need more support to do this.

#### **Kim's Convenience**


Written by Ins Choi started at the 2011 Toronto Fringe Festival and was picked up by Soulpepper for numerous runs and is now streaming internationally on Netflix. Ins won the new play contest that year, previous to that he had shopped his play around and everyone had said no. The audiences at Fringe spoke for him with line ups around the block. Industry took notice and the rest is history...

#### We are part of the Canadian Association of Fringe Festivals (CAFF) & World Fringe

With other 30 festivals in Canada and some in the US, we all follow the mandates of CAFF. Returning the box office monies to the artists, that we have no control over the artistic content of the shows and we provide accessible opportunities to participate. We also participate in the biannual World Fringe congress and connect with Fringes from across the Globe, including a recent partnership with the Brighton and Icelandic Fringes

#### The Fringe is a playground!

We know that sometimes big things come out of the fringe and that is wonderful but it is also a place for artists to experiment, to take risks and sometimes to fail, how else do we learn and do better?



# Your support goes a long way

Fringe is unique because it is a non-juried festival, and holds an annual lottery to program the festival, selecting shows at random. We believe every voice has an equal right to be heard and that is why our lottery is two phase, ensuring at least 50% of all slots are held by BIPOC artists. And because we **return 100% of the ticket price** to the artist your donation helps us provide our platform.




# Next Stage Theatre Festival.

Offers performance lovers a more intimate, cozy festival experience. Next Stage is the curated sister event of the summer Fringe, where approximately 6-10 shows are programmed by a jury of industry professionals. Next Stage artists are on the cutting edge of "indie" theatre and are creating urgent, exciting work. Patrons can expect to see artists at Next Stage who are about to hit the mainstream – Next Stage artists frequently break out into CBC, Mirvish, Broadway or Netflix hits.



In 2023 we will move the dates of the Festival from January to October and are looking forward to a new chapter for this 12 year old festival. Artists are ambitious in this festival, they don't pay to participate but split the box office with the festival. Next Stage offers opportunities for artists to be offered the next step in their career as well as a chance to experiment and take risks.

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### Youth Support.

NYR is supported by the Jon Kaplan Legacy Fund

Offering 6-10 youth workshops and training in the art of reviewing My First Fringe will be supported by the SM Blair Foundation

During March Break we train 10 teens in producing and creating a theatre piece Teen Fringe is supported by long time donor Neville Austin

Each summer we offer 20 teens a chance to learn acting, singing, dancing and writing



The Theatre Entrepreneurs' Network and Training Program was created in 2014 by The Toronto Fringe Festival to address a growing need in theatre training: how to actually make theatre happen.
Since its inception, TENT has served over 200 emerging artists by providing free, intensive training in the skills vital to making their work a reality (such as managing budgets, marketing, fundraising, and grantwriting), and by connecting them with some of Canada's artistic innovators, leaders, and producers.

TENT invests in the future of arts and culture in Toronto by creating, training, and cultivating community. We equip emerging artists with the skills and human connections to empower them to create meaningful art from informed perspectives, and on their own terms. Participating in TENT will connect you to your peers, deepen your relationship to your work, support what you want to build, and your understanding of existing systems.



The team behind the Toronto Fringe is small but mighty. We are a core team of five full time positions; Executive Director, Managing Director, Communications Manager, Associate Producer and Projects and Operations Manager. In addition we have three contract workers who join us as we start to prepare for the Summer Festival. Our team then grows to over 150 people including technicians, front of house folks and patron services representatives. We provide digital ticketing to all our patrons that requires internet and tablets for each venue.

We have an office in the east end of Toronto and we have an offsite storage space to house our patio infrastructure plus pieces of equipment. All these things come with a cost, and in Toronto this isn't cheap but it is necessary. The strength of this administrative foundation is how we get to be so strong in supporting our artists and patrons. 15



## POSTSCRIPT

Is our patio and lounge spaces. In 2018 we re-branded the Fringe beer tent to the POSTSCRIPT Patio, using the skating rink at Scadding Court. In 2022 we moved back to the Tranzac club to host our Patio where we plan to be for the foreseeable future. The idea of this space is to create a hubsoutside of the festival venues. A place for our regular theatre goers and artists to come together but also for new and prospective patrons to learn about us, to come for a refreshment and to meet an artist, or sample our local food vendors, or take part in one of our interactive happenings.

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### Patio & Lounge.

The Toronto Fringe hosts the POSTSCRIPT Patio at the Tranzac Club in the heart of the Annex.

We offer daily free programming as well, audiences can grab a drink, some food, and experience the concerts, interactive performances, and dance parties at this vibrant hub.

As part of our pandemic recovery we have created a Sustainability Fund, that looks to conserving our future, safeguarding us against any other interruptions


### Ticketing

Specific investment will be made to sustain our POSTSCRIPT Patio, as this is where the community comes together **TAX RECEIPTING POLICY:** Donors at various giving levels receive tangible benefits in conjunction with their support.
